Alfie Edor Erickson was born on February 26, 1931 to Edward & Velma (Cox) Erickson at their farm home in Wadena County. He passed away on Saturday evening at Tri-County Hospital at the age of 75. Alfie was given to the Lord in Holy Baptism on April 26, 1931. He graduated from Wadena High School in 1950. After high school he served 4 years in the U.S. Navy honorably discharged on April 2, 1954. He was united in marriage to Maxine Ruby Peterson on June 6, 1954 in Wadena. Alfie then attended and graduated from the North Dakota Agricultural College (NDSU) in 1958. Following graduation he took a job with Potlach Corp. in Cloquet where he worked until 1985. Alfie and Maxine then returned to the Wadena area where he started his own electrical business in 1987. Alfie was preceded in death by his parents; sisters June Johnson & Vergie Peters; brothers Stanley, Manley and Earl.
