September 16, 1945 - December 28, 2008

Allen Lowell Erickson was born on September 16, 1945 to Walmer and Myrtle (Berglin) Erickson in Alexandria, MN. He passed away on Sunday, December 28, 2008, at the age of 63, at Abbott Northwestern Hospital in Minneapolis. Allen served in the Army Reserve and United States National Guard from 1966 through 1974. Allen was united in marriage with Kathryn Jeanne (Hovet) Erickson on September 27, 1969 in Minneapolis. He will be remembered as a dedicated teacher, coach and athletic director at Sebeka High School for 34 years. He was a member of the American Legion, and Whitetail Run Golf Club. He enjoyed golfing, and was an avid sports fan. He especially enjoyed spending time at the cabin with his family. Al was a loving, caring, and giving man to his family, friends, and students. Allen was preceded in death by his parents Walmer and Myrtle. He is survived by his loving wife, Kathy; sons, Mathias (Sara) of Brainerd, and Nathan (Sara) of Sebeka; daughters, Jennifer (Ryan) Lake of New Prague, and Jill (Chad) Bettin of Avon, 9 grandchildren; brother, Wayne Erickson of Alexandria; and sister, Gwen Schmidt of Lake Oswego, OR. Funeral services were held at 11:00 AM on Friday, January 2, 2009 at Calvary Lutheran Church in Alexandria with Pastor Dale Olson officiating. Interment was in Evergreen Cemetery in Alexandria. Honorary pallbearers were all the fine young men he had the privilege of coaching.
