Alphonse Henry Imdieke was born on September 4, 1915 to Joseph and Margaret (Brang) Imdieke at Padua, Minnesota. Al passed away on March 25, 2005 at the Elders Home in New York Mills at the age of 89 years. He grew up and attended school in Bluffton Township.
