



## Arlene D. Anderson

December 3, 1919 - December 21, 2014

The memorial service for Arlene Anderson of Wadena will be held at 11:00 a.m. on Saturday, December 27, 2014, at the Johnson-Schuller Chapel in Wadena, with Christie Meier, AIM, officiating.

Arlene Dorothy (Seehuetter) Anderson, age 95, of Wadena passed away on December 21, 2014. She was born in St. Paul as an only child to Thomas J and Emilie L (Schoell) Seehuetter on December 3, 1919. Arlene's mother died when Arlene was 9 months old, so she lived in Hayward, WI with grandparents for the next 13 years and attended country schools. As a teenager, she returned to St. Paul to live with her father and graduated from St. Paul Washington High School. For the next 9 years she worked at West Publishing before marrying Harold Anderson in 1947. They lived in North Minneapolis, Columbia Heights and Princeton before moving to Wadena in 1982. They had 3 sons: Paul, Ray and Lloyd. Arlene worked as a church secretary at St. Timothy's Lutheran in Fridley and Trinity Lutheran in Princeton. One of Arlene's greatest achievements was learning to live with only one arm after losing one to cancer at age 43. This didn't stop her from serving as executive secretary of the United Way in Princeton for a number of years, nor from fishing and crafting. Arlene enjoyed reading, letter writing, crosswords, afternoon drives, and visiting with family and friends. She lived independently at home until age 92, before relocating to Fair Oaks Lodge in Wadena.

Arlene was preceded in death by her parents, and Harold, her husband of 50 years. She is survived by sons Paul (Onni Sharp) of Wadena, Ray (Peggy Hoxtell) of Holdingford, and Lloyd of Brainerd; 10 grandchildren and 7 great grandchildren; and a wealth of friends.

Burial will be in Union Cemetery in St. Paul, MN.
