



Bernard "Bud" Hoemberg

May 13, 1918 - January 31, 2013

The Mass of Christian Burial for Bernard "Bud" Hoemberg, a resident of Harmony House Assisted Living in Motley, and formerly of rural Staples, will be celebrated at 11:00 a.m. on Thursday, February 7, 2012, at the Sacred Heart Catholic Church in Staples with Father Arlie Sowada as celebrant. Friends may call at the church on Thursday one hour prior to the Mass. Bernard "Bud" J. Hoemberg, died suddenly on January 31, 2013, at the Harmony House of Motley which was his home since December 2000.

He lived his whole life on the Hoemberg family farm in Staples, MN, where he was born to John and Mary (Freund) Hoemberg on May 13, 1918. Bud completed 8th grade at the Sacred Heart school in Staples. He ended his education at that time to work on the family farm. He dedicated his life to farming. He was a member of Sacred Heart Church. Bud enjoyed playing cards with his sister Mary Lou, and taking her for Sunday drives in the country after Mass.
