August 21, 1911 - June 3, 2008

Bertha Sydna Westad was born to Samuel and Hannah (Walter) Beaman on August 21, 1911 in Deer Creek, Minnesota. She passed away, at the age of 96, on Tuesday, June 3, 2008 at Tri-County Hospital in Wadena. She graduated from Deer Creek High School in 1929 and was valedictorian of her class. She raised pickles for the pickle factory in Deer Creek to pay for her class ring. She was enrolled in Normal School in Wadena for teachers' training. She taught country school at District 123 near Henning. During this year she met her future husband. The next year she taught at Elmhurst School near Richville. Bertha was united in marriage with Alvin J. Westad on January 25, 1932 in Fergus Falls. After teaching she was employed at Wesley Hospital in the dietary kitchen, and at Watco. As a homemaker she enjoyed making baby quilts for newborns, babysitting, and was known for her pie baking. She loved her family and grandchildren. They loved going to flea markets and collecting fruit jars and making sets. Bertha was a church circle member who helped served many Rotary meals. Bertha was preceded in death by her husband, Alvin; parents, Samuel and Hannah; daughter, Valerie Klever; brothers, Irvin, Clarence, Marvin, Ralph, and Lester Beaman; sisters, Blanche Embertson, Alta Edes, and Helen Mursu, sons-in-law, Norman Thomson, and Gene Munson; great-granddaughters, Jennifer and Amy Andrie; and nieces and nephews. She is survived by son, Lance (Joy) Westad of Farmington; daughters, Dolly (Harold) Deckert of Buena Park, CA, and Karen Munson of Richville; 15 grandchildren, 28 great-grandchildren and 2

great-great-grandchildren; sister, Mae Hanebuth of Wadena; and many nieces and nephews. Funeral services were held at 11:00 AM on Saturday, June 7, 2008 at Immanuel Lutheran Church in Wadena with Pastor Rob Nelson officiating. Interment was in Wadena Cemetery.
