Betty Jane Kempe was born to John Henry and Jeanette (Rens) VanMiddendorp on December 22, 1938, in their farmhouse in Rock Valley, IA. She passed away on November 17, 2009, at the age of 70 years, at Lakewood Health Systems in Staples, MN. Betty was united in marriage with Robert Leroy Kempe on June 11, 1956 at St. Paul Lutheran Church in Bertha. Having lived in the community for 57 years she will be remembered as a dedicated elementary teacher and principal. She was a member of the Ladies Aide, Empty Stocking Fund, Salvation Army, Teachers Retirement Organization, and the England Prairie Pioneer Club. Her hobbies and interests included hunting, fishing, gardening, and embroidering. She loved spending time with her grandchildren, reading, and playing cards. Betty was preceded in death by her father, John and her brother-in-law, Don Peterson. She is survived by her husband, Robert of Verndale; her mother, Jeanette of Wadena; sons Bradley Kempe (MaryDee) of Verndale, and Rodney (Brenda) Kempe of Hewitt; five grandchildren; and her sister-in-law, Bette Peterson of Wadena. Funeral services were held at 2:00 p.m. on November 20, 2009 at St. John Lutheran Church in Wadena, with Vicar Stephen Melzer officiating.
