Bonnie Jean (Resch) Marcyes of Clarissa, formerly of Wadena, passed away on May 19, 2012. Bonnie was born on December 29, 1942 to Howard and Hazel (Leete) Witthuhn in Wadena. She graduated from Wadena High School in 1961. Bonnie married Tom Resch of Park Rapids on November 17, 1962, at Wadena United Methodist Church. Bonnie cared for a herd of 20 Holstein cows on a farm east of Wadena while Tom worked the fields until the time of his death on April 17, 1984. Bonnie married Norbert Kuehne in May of 1987 and moved to a hobby farm five miles north of Clarissa where she and Norbert semi-retired and raised beef cows and chickens until his death on June 9, 1997. Bonnie married Jesse Marcyes on March 20, 1999. Bonnie's love for animals continued throughout her life as she and Jesse have a pet barn to share with family and friends. Bonnie's pets included llamas, miniature donkeys and horses, ducks, pygmy goats, emus, and pot-belly pigs. Her interests also included gardening and doll collecting.
