



Carolyn Buchholz

February 14, 1934 - May 16, 2010

Carolyn Jean Buchholz was born on February 14, 1934 to Axel E. and Carrie (Beyer) Carlson in Oakland, NE. She attended Oakland High School, graduating with the Class of 1951. Carolyn and Myron "Buck" Buchholz were united in marriage on May 5, 1956 in Edgecomb, ME. She traveled with Buck and the children living in Maine, Nebraska, Illinois, California, the Philippine Islands, and Hawaii. In 1970 Myron retired from the U.S. Navy and they settled on a farm in Deer Creek, MN, where they lived for 27 years. They lived a year in Wadena, then moved to Detroit Lakes, and shortly after his death Carolyn returned to Wadena. For 21 years Carolyn wrote the "Deer Creek News" for the Wadena Pioneer Journal. After working at the Henning Advocate and New York Mills Herald she retired in 1995. Carolyn was a long time member of the Deer Creek American Legion Auxiliary and Wadena VFW Auxiliary. In her free time she enjoyed dancing, reading, playing cards and board games. Carolyn passed away on May 16, 2010, at age 76, at Tri-County Hospital in Wadena. Carolyn was preceded in death by her husband Myron; her parents Axel and Carrie; brothers Kenneth, Floyd, Dennis, Myron, and Erwin Carlson; sisters Marion Franklin, Shirley Weeces, and LaRose Carlson; and a granddaughter Amanda. She is survived by her sons Roger of Milton, FL, and Michael (Janet) of Wadena; daughter Kerri (Tom) Saeger of Ortonville; four grandchildren and one great-grandchild; four brothers-in-law and four sisters-in-law; and numerous nephews and nieces. Funeral services were held on May 20, 2010, at 11:00 a.m. in the Trinity Lutheran Church in

Deer Creek, with Pastor Paul Yearyeen officiating. Interment was in the Trinity Lutheran Cemetery in rural Deer Creek.
