Daryl “Tiny” Gene Worden was born to Idell and Vernie (Gessner) Worden on June 2, 1944 in Bertha, MN. He passed away, at the age of 66, on October 12, 2010, at Tri-County Hospital in Wadena. Tiny was baptized and confirmed at Immanuel Lutheran Church in Bartlett Township. Tiny was united in marriage with Shirley Rousslang in April 5, 1975 at St. Ann’s Catholic Church in Wadena. Tiny worked at Arden Hills Arsenal in Arden Hills before moving back to Wadena. Many will remember him for his ownership of Tiny’s Skelly Station, co-ownership of T&T Stakes & Bridging, and later working at Carter Oil for over 20 years. He was a member of the Wadena Elks Lodge and Minnesota Deer Hunters Association. He loved spending time with his three grandkids, Carter, Abigail and Brady. He did childcare for Carter for three and a half years. Carter was his special buddy. They enjoyed their afternoons together, riding 4-wheeler, playing, and napping. He was always there to watch his grandkids and spend time with them. Tiny also enjoyed hunting, fishing, yard work, riding 4-wheeler, going to coffee and visiting with friends. Tiny was preceded in death by his wife, Shirley on March 28, 1999; his parents; brothers Dale and Dallas; and sisters Betty Theisen and June Bjone. He is survived by his sons Michael (Kristi) and Andrew (Niki) both of Wadena; brothers Donald (Lucy) of Kerkhoven and Duaine (Nancy) of Dixon, CA; sister Lorraine Sellnow of Bertha; and special friend Helen Branstner of Wadena. Funeral services were held at 11:00 a.m. on October 15, 2010, at the St. John Lutheran Church in Wadena, with Pastor Stephen Meltzer officiating.
