Douglas Ralph Heern was born to Ralph and Birdie (Skaro) Heern on August 12, 1948 in Wadena, MN. Doug lived his entire life in the Wadena and Verndale area. He attended and graduated from the Wadena Public Schools. In May 1968 he entered the United States Army and was honorably discharged in May 1970. Doug was a member of the Wadena VFW. He was employed as a furniture machinist for many years at Homecrest Industries in Wadena. He enjoyed the outdoors as an avid hunter and fisherman. In 1994, he was honored to be selected as the Wadena County Soil and Water Conservation, District Conservation Cooperator of the Year.
