



Ervin Hendershot

August 25, 1909 - February 10, 2010

Ervin E. Hendershot, age 100 of Parkers Prairie, Minn., died on February 10, 2010 at Tri-County Hospital in Wadena. Ervin was born on August 25, 1909 to Jack and Mary (Jenson) Hendershot in Hewitt. He served in the Army's 5th Armored Division from March 6, 1942 to October 8, 1945 and was part of D-Day during World War II. He was wounded in two different actions and received a Purple Heart. He married Myrtle Eggert on February 8, 1947, and the couple built their homestead in rural Parkers Prairie, where they farmed and raised their family. Ervin liked to be outdoors. He fished, hunted, trapped and enjoyed working with wood, especially diamond willow. He kept in excellent shape well into his 90s, trimming tree limbs, building birdhouses and recycling scrap iron. He will be remembered by his family for his strength and endurance. A memorial service was held at 10:00 AM on Saturday, February 13, 2010 at the Domian-Anderson Funeral Home in Bertha with the Rev. Dr. Randy Taber officiating. Military honors were provided by the Minnesota National Guard's Honor Guard. Ervin was buried in Woodside Cemetery. Pallbearers were Scott and Dennis Hendershot; and Delroy, Tony, Zachary and Dalton Winchester. Survivors include his wife, Myrtle; sons Scott (Dolores) Hendershot and Dennis Hendershot of Parkers Prairie; stepson Delroy (Sue) Winchester of Anoka; one step-grandson and four step-grandchildren. Ervin was preceded in death by his parents; sisters Bernice Finck and Florence Hennagir; brothers Warren, Elmer and Harry Hendershot; and step-grandson Shawn Winchester.
