Frank Peery, age 90 of Eagle Bend passed away on Wednesday, October 6, 2004, at the Central Todd County Care Center in Clarissa. Frank Ellis Peery was born on December 16, 1913 at Linton, North Dakota to and Ward and Julia (Nieland) Peery. He spent his early life at Larchwood, Iowa where he received his education. Frank married Irene Conrad at Jeffers, Minnesota on January 3, 1939. To this union 4 children were born: Rita, Woodrow, Elmyra and Julia. Frank was baptized and confirmed in the Lutheran faith. Frank was a farmer and lived on a farm southwest of Eagle Bend until he was 1987 when he moved to his home in Eagle Bend. He held offices at the Immanuel Lutheran Church and helped out at the church cemetery. He enjoyed spending his free time traveling and visiting with people. After his stroke, he resided in the Central Todd County Care Center in Clarissa. Frank was preceded in death by his parents, Ward and Julia Peery; brothers James and Earl; and sisters Viola, Evelyn and Florence. He is survived by his wife Irene in Eagle Bend; son Woodrow (Rosamond) of Eagle Bend; daughters Rita (Wallace) Decker of Eagle Bend, Elmyra (William) Jerome of Parkers Prairie and Julia Peery of Parkers Prairie; 12 grandchildren and 8 great-grandchildren; and sister Lillian Whiltington of Paradise, California.
