Gary V. Rousslang, age 56, of Amarillo, Texas, formerly of Verndale, passed-away on September 12, 2007, in Texas. He was born to Anthony "Tony" and Francella "Fran" (Vornbrock) Rousslang, Sr., on January 15, 1951 in Wadena, Minnesota.
