George Lee Hendrickson, age 71 of Wadena, passed away quietly at his home on Tuesday afternoon, February 13th. George was born to his parents Gustave & Dorothy (Johnson) Hendrickson in Crookston on August 28, 1935. George was confirmed at Trinity Lutheran Church in Crookston. He also graduated from Crookston High School before attending the University of North Dakota in Grand Forks for a short period of time. After he left UND he attended the Minneapolis School of Art where he took photography classes. He began working at Rex McDonald Studio in 1959 where he worked until retiring in 1998. On July 10, 1966 he was united in marriage to Sandra Kay Lee in Larimore, ND. George was a member of Immanuel Lutheran Church and was a regular at the Men's Breakfast group. He also enjoyed reading, hunting, fishing, camping and spending time with his family and friends. For over 20 years George volunteered his time for lawn care at Immanuel Lutheran during the summer months. George was preceded in death by his parents; sisters Ann Myrold & Lois Escherich.
