



Gordon Zeise

November 26, 1927 - May 1, 2011

Gordon Chester Zeise was born to Fred William and Olive Bertha (Vick) Zeise on November 26, 1927 in Deer Creek Township, MN. Gordon served in the United States Army from March 21, 1946 until his honorable discharge at Fort Lawton, WA, on September 15, 1947. He and Gwenellyn Romaine Hatling were united in marriage on October 9, 1949 at Our Savior's Lutheran Church in Dalton. He was a dedicated dairy farmer until his retirement in 1985. He was a charter member of the Deer Creek Lion's Club, a Deer Creek School Board member for many years, and active with the American Legion, and Deer Creek Rod & Gun Club. His hobbies and interests included hunting, fishing, wildlife preservation, tree planting & reforestation, and spending time with his family. Gordon died on May 1, 2011, at the age of 83, in St. Cloud. He was preceded in death by his parents Fred and Olive; and brothers Bernard, Herbert, and Harold. He is survived by his loving wife Gwen of Deer Creek; son Paul Zeise of Bluffton; daughters Becky (Kim) Lovgren of Buchanan, ND, Kathy (Ron) Johnson of Hollister, CA, and Bonnie (Scott) Brown of Cloquet; six grandchildren Monica Lovgren Dragt, Brian Lovgren, Keven Johnson, Julia Zeise, Christopher and Gwenellyn Brown, & eight great-grandchildren; brother Gerald Zeise of Deer Creek; and sisters Lucile Winter of Fresno, CA, Mabel Zeise of Battle Lake, Eunice Waskosky, and Dorothy Waskosky both of Henning; many nieces & nephews; and all of his hunting & fishing friends. Funeral services were held at 11:00 a.m. on May 5, 2011, in the Salem United Methodist Church in Deer Creek with Pastor Mark Bateson officiating. Military

honors were provided by the Edward Carlson Post 283, American Legion, Deer Creek, MN. Pallbearers were Gordon's sons-in-law Kim Lovgren, Ron Johnson, Scott Brown, and his friends Tom Brauch, Doug Stave, and Randy Stave. Burial was in Oak Hill Cemetery in Deer Creek.
