



Harriet Pokorney

April 17, 1920 - June 11, 2009

Funeral services for Harriet Wilma Pokorney were held at 11:00 AM on Tuesday, June 16, 2009, at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Bertha with Reverend Blake Rickbeil presiding. Harriet passed away at the age of 89 years on June 11, 2009 at the Tri-County Hospital in Wadena. Harriet was born on April 17, 1920 to Erwin and Edna (Erdmann) Ehlke of Oak Valley Township. She graduated from high school and attended St. Cloud Teachers College. She was united in marriage with Charles George Pokorney on June 25, 1944 at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Bertha and together they operated the family farm near Wrightstown. In addition to caring and providing a home for her own family, Harriet served her community as a teacher, daycare provider and foster grandparent. Most knew her simply as Grandma Harriet. She also worked as a cosmetologist. She served her church as a member of St. Paul's Lutheran Church's Ladies Aid. During her quiet time, she enjoyed gardening, cooking, sewing and quilting. She also enjoyed entertaining in her home. Harriet was preceded in death by her husband Charles on May 26, 1970; parents Erwin and Edna; daughter Rosemary Ann Wade on January 23, 1986; and sisters Erna Hartung and Rosemary Beebe. She is survived by her daughters Beth (Merle) Kassube of Maple Grove and KayLynn (Mike) Pokorney of Lino Lakes; son John (Judy) of Bertha; 6 grandchildren and 5 great-grandchildren; sister-in-law Violet Wohlert of Wadena; and 10 nieces and nephews.
