Helen Beatrice (Monson) Babcock, the daughter of Martin and Anna (Ford) Monson, was born on February 8, 1915, in Spring Grove, MN. Helen graduated from Spring Grove High School with the class of 1933. Helen was united in marriage with Raymond E. Babcock on November 10, 1946, at the Wilmington Church in rural Spring Grove. They raised dairy cattle near Deer Creek until moving into town in 1972. Later in life she lived at Humphrey Manor in Wadena. In the past few years she was a resident at Golden Living Center in Henning, where she passed away on March 30, 2010, at the age of 95 years. Helen was preceded in death by her husband, Raymond; her parents, Martin and Anna; sisters Inga (Alvin) Goodno and Lillian (Leo) Harris; and brothers Marvin, Martin, Leonard, and Lawrence Monson. She is survived by one son Lyle (Mary) of Apple Valley; grandson Scott Babcock of Lakeville; granddaughter Kate Babcock of Ames IA; sisters Ruth Meyer of Grand Junction, CO, and Hazel Sater of Austin, MN; and many nieces, nephews, and friends. Funeral services were held on April 3, 2010, at 11:00 a.m. in the Good Shepherd Lutheran Church in Henning, with Pastor Roger Johnson officiating. Pallbearers were Helen's family.
