Helen Frances (Wiebesick) Davison was born on a farm near Brookings, South Dakota on September 9, 1920, the daughter of Martin and Blanche (Stewart) Wiebesick. Helen attended 1st and 2nd grades in rural schools in South Dakota. Her family moved to Cass County in Minnesota. She attended rural schools through 8th grade in Sebeka and Staples. She graduated from Staples High School in 1942 and Normal Training in 1943. Helen taught school from 1943 through 1951 in Otter Tail County. After graduating from St. Cloud Teachers Training she taught 6th grade in Osakis from 1952 to 1958 and 5th grade for one year in Le Sueur. Helen was united in marriage with Joseph E. Davison on June 7, 1958 in Wadena. She was a 4-H leader for 5 years, and taught Sunday School and Bible School in the First Congregational Church for many years. Helen was a member of the Historical Society. She enjoyed gardening, cooking, sewing and quilting. Helen was preceded in death by her husband; her parents; brothers, Martin, Charles, Richard and Robert Wiebesick; and sisters, Louise Sowers and Elizabeth Biedalman. She is survived by daughter, Alice (Joseph) Nelson of Sioux Falls, SD.; three grandsons, Joel, Nick and Chris; and sister, Emma Nedreau of Belgrade.
