April 8, 1921 - March 25, 2010

Funeral services for Helen Florence Walker, a resident of the Harmony House in Motley and formerly of Hewitt, were held at 11:00 AM on Monday, March 29, 2010 at the United Methodist Church in Hewitt with Reverend Kathy Schuler presiding. Helen passed away at the age of 88 years on Thursday, March 25, 2010 at the Lakewood Health System in Staples. Helen was born on April 8, 1921 to John and Grace (Harris) Wahner at their home in Stowe Prairie Township. She attended country school. She was united in marriage with Glenn Dale Walker on September 12, 1940 at Hewitt. Helen was a life long resident of the area. She was a farm wife for 38 years then moved into the Bertha Manor and became the caretaker for the next 25 years. She was a member of the Hewitt Senior Citizens, Homemakers and RSVP Club. She enjoyed working on crafts, especially rug making, embroidery and quilting. Helen was preceded in death by her husband Glenn on October 18, 1978; parents John and Grace Wahner; and brother Harold (Dutch) Wahner.
