



Herbert Snyder

November 18, 1928 - May 2, 2011

Funeral services for Herbert Duane Snyder, of Eagle Bend, MN and formerly of Paynesville, MN, were held at 10:30 AM on Thursday, May 5, 2011 at the Assemblies of God Church in Eagle Bend with Pastors Robert Bernard and Bob Kaumans presiding. Herb passed away at the St. Cloud Hospital in St. Cloud, MN on Monday, May 2, 2011 from injuries sustained in an accident at his ranch in Burleene Township. Herb was born on November 18, 1928 to Alvin and Minnie (Kohler) Snyder at Paynesville, MN. He attended the Lake Henry School from 1934 until 1936 and Grove School until 1938. He then attended District 139 in Zion Township until graduating at Belgrade, MN in 1942. He farmed with his parents until he was united in marriage with Lois Mae Frank on November 16, 1951 at Paynesville. Together they farmed in Zion Township until 1972 when they sold the home farm and moved to a 320 acre ranch in Burleene Township, south of Eagle Bend, MN. Herb loved raising beef cattle and had some of the best. He also worked at Building Bridges with three different companies for 10 years. He thrived on hard work and good conversations with friends. He loved to fish and play music with his accordion and keyboard. He played at the Clotho Ice Cream Social for 14 years. He also played for weddings and parties in Minnesota, Iowa and South Dakota. He also loved his grandchildren and great-grandchildren. He will be remembered fondly as "Hard-Hat Herb", and wanted to die with his boots on. You got your wish, Herb, now rest awhile. Herb was preceded in death by his parents Alvin and Minnie; and sisters Edith Miller, Evelyn Nelson and

Dorothy Harapat. He is survived by his wife Lois; son Ron of Eagle Bend; daughters Susan (David) Lorenz of St. Augusta, MN and Cindy Drevlow of Long Prairie; 4 grandchildren and 4 great-grandchildren; and brothers Leslie Snyder of Paynesville, Harry Snyder of Paynesville and LaVern Snyder of PeeWee Valley, KY. Pallbearers were Marty Frank, Don Frank, Terry Zimmer, Dave Thorpe, Ken Miller and Merle Frank. Interment was in the Salem Cemetery located in Zion Township, rural Paynesville.
