Irene G. Line of Verndale was born March 5, 1922, to Frank Sr. and Mattie (Meech) Birkholz in Orton Township, MN. She passed away March 9, 2011, at Lakewood Care Center in Staples. Irene was baptized and confirmed at Nimrod Lutheran Church, growing up around Nimrod and graduating from Sebeka High School in 1939. Irene Birkholz and Stanley Line were married February 22, 1941. After their wedding they moved to Truman. In 1944, they returned to Nimrod to purchase and operate the café until 1947. They then moved to Oylen to purchase and operate the grocery store there until a fire destroyed it in 1954. It was then that they set their sites on farming in Verndale where they purchased various farms around Verndale and Wadena. Irene's interests were rug weaving from 1958 to 2009, gardening, and selling vegetables at the local farmer's market, cooking, and baking. She belonged to the Beef Growers, and the Birthday Club. She was a helping and loving wife, mother, and grandmother. She loved playing cards with family and friends. Irene was preceded in death by her parents Frank and Mattie; sister Audrey Kadow; brother Frank Birkholz; grandson Samuel Rach; and son-in-law LeRoy Rach. She is survived by her husband Stanley of Verndale; sons Keith of Kent, WA, and Kermit (Inez) of Verndale; daughter Karen Rach of Wadena; eight grandchildren, 12½ great-grandchildren, and two great-great-grandchildren. Funeral services will be held at 11:00 a.m. on March 15, 2011, at the Immanuel Lutheran Church in Wadena, with Pastor Stephen Meltzer officiating. Honorary pallbearers will be Irene's nieces and nephews.
