



## Leonard Anthos

June 29, 1920 - October 27, 2005

Leonard Anthos, age 85, passed away on Thursday, October 27, 2005 at the Long Prairie Memorial Nursing Home in Long Prairie. Leonard was born on June 29, 1920 to Thomas and Clara (Gross) Anthos at Staples, MN. He was united in marriage with Josephine Ann Hengemuehle at Staples on July 16, 1941. On July 11, 1942, Leonard was inducted into the US Army at Fort Snelling. He served his country as a Tank Destroyer Crewman in the European African and Middle Eastern theaters of operations during World War II. After the war, he was stationed for a period of time in Korea. After being honorably discharged on October 11, 1945, he returned to Josephine. He worked driving truck and the couple lived in the Todd County area a number of times before returning in 1992. They lived at Baraga, MI and also Wyoming and Nevada. In 1993, Leonard was involved in accident and he and Josephine lived at the Central Todd County Care Center in Clarissa until her death on October 15, 1993. He later entered the Long Prairie Memorial Nursing Home. Leonard was a member of the American Legion Post in Baraga, MI. He enjoyed playing cards and particularly enjoyed when his grandchildren came to visit. Leonard was preceded in death by his wife Josephine; parents Thomas and Clara; infant son Paul; 2 granddaughters and 2 great-grandchildren; brother Lawrence and sister Ann Peters. He is survived by his sons Leonard "Roy"(Barbara) of Michigan and Kelly (Chris) of Wyoming; daughters Shirley (Robert Johnson) of Michigan, Carol (Pete Archambeau) of Wyoming, Paulette Reed of Georgia, Rhonda (James

Krueger) of Wisconsin and Terri (Ken Barlow) of Utah; 13 grandchildren and 9 great-grandchildren. He is also survived by sisters-in-law Myra Duklet of Clarissa and Donna Neuberger of Harris. A Funeral Mass was held for Leonard on Monday, October 31, 2005 at the St. Joseph's Catholic Church in Clarissa with Father John Caskey presiding. Pallbearers were Bob Johnson, Jim Krueger, Ken Barlow and Larry Johnson. Military Honors were provided by members of the Minnesota National Guard.
