Lisa LuAnn Sandberg was born on July 17, 1967 to Donald and Rachel (Thompson) Edwards in Fargo, ND. Lisa passed away on Friday morning, July 27, at Lake Region Hospital in Fergus Falls at 40 years of age. Lisa's family was with her at the end of her battle with cancer. Lisa has lived in the Staples area since her family moved there when she one year old. Following graduation from Staples High School, Lisa went to work for the Staples World newspaper. In more recent years, Lisa has been working at Mid-Central Federal Savings Bank in Wadena. She has many friends through her time with the Staples World and Mid-Central. Lisa was a member of Zion Free Lutheran Church in Wadena. Lisa married Larry Sandberg on March 19, 1992. The couple have five children, Ariana, Sienna, Josiah, Tahlia, and Kiarra. Lisa has two step-children, Ashley and Elliott. Lisa is survived by her husband; children; step-children; parents; sisters, Deanna of Moorhead, Kathryn of Staples, Kara of Somerset, WI, and Rayme of Brainerd; brothers, Jathan (Kim) of Afton and Justin of Somerset, WI; aunts and uncles; nieces and nephews; and cousins. All of her family were important and loved by Lisa. Lisa is preceded in death by her grandparents, Rev. Alexander and Ruth Thompson, Ray and Mary Edwards, and Sarah Edwards. Funeral services will be held Thursday, August 2, at 11:00 AM at the Christian and Missionary Alliance Church in Verndale with Pastor Stephen Papillon officiating. Interment will be in the Evergreen Hill Cemetery in Staples. Visitation will be Wednesday, from 4:00 PM-8:00 PM, at the Johnson Memorial Home in
