May 16, 1921 - February 4, 2008

Loretta Agnes Philomena Schwartz was born on May 16, 1921 to parents Herman and Emma (Tabery) Rebeschke in Frazee, Minnesota. She passed-away at age 86, on Monday, February 4, 2008 at Fair Oaks Lodge in Wadena. Loretta attended Wadena School District 165 and proudly received her GED in 1981. She was united in marriage with Casper (Cap) Schwartz on August 27, 1940 at St. Ann's Catholic Church in Wadena. As a member of the Wadena community for 80 years she belonged to Christian Mothers, Catholic Aid, two Homemakers clubs, the Wadena Garden Club and the VFW Auxiliary. Loretta was a proud homemaker, wife, mother, and grandmother, and served as a home health aid for 10 years. She enjoyed cooking, sewing, quilting, flowers, cards, and family gatherings. Loretta was preceded in death by her parents; son-in-law Roger Mohs; granddaughter Jennifer Mohs; brothers Ferdinand, Wilferd, Joseph, Lloyd, and Jerry Rebeschke; and sister Catherine Schwartz.
