The Mass of Christian Burial for Lorraine Elizabeth (Malone) Goeden of Wadena was celebrated on Tuesday, June 12, 2012 at St. Ann's Catholic Church in Wadena with Father Donald Wagner and Father Wilfred Theisen as celebrants. Lorraine passed away at the age of 83 years on Saturday, June 9, 2012 at home, surrounded by her loving family. She was born June 2, 1929 in Leaf River Township, Wadena County, to Patrick and Magdalena (Tabery) Malone. She grew up in the Bluegrass area and attended country school through the eighth grade. She married Joseph Goeden at St. Hubert's Catholic Church, Bluegrass, MN, on June 7, 1949. They farmed west of Wadena and raised a family of 8 children.
