Memorial services for Louis Frank Randall of Verndale, were held at 10:30 AM on Wednesday, August 29, 2012 at the Schuller Family Funeral Homes Verndale Chapel with Pastor Dennis Gordon presiding. Louis passed away at the age of 58 years on Thursday, August 23, 2012 at his home in Verndale. Louie was born on August 3, 1954 at Vancouver, Washington to Burnell Lincoln and Helen Eva (LeMoine) Randall. He graduated from Wadena High School in 1972. He was united in marriage with Lisa Maria Umland on April 25, 1975 at St. Frederick's Catholic Church in Verndale. He was a self-employed small engine mechanic who enjoyed rebuilding motorcycles. Louie was active in his community as a member of the Masons, Verndale Fire Dept., Verndale City Council, as well as his volunteering as an EMT and boy scout leader. He was an original member of the group of motorcycle enthusiasts that started "Stampede for Wishes", an event that later became "Kruzin-4-Kids", whose profits benefit Make-A-Wish Foundation. Louie enjoyed music and playing the guitar, as well as being outdoors gardening, hunting, ice fishing, camping and going for a ride on his motorcycle. He especially enjoyed spending time with family and friends. He was able to enjoy the great weather and visiting at a reunion held earlier this month for his birthday. Louie was preceded in death by his parents Burnell and Helen; sisters Patty Weaver and Debbie Tersteeg; and son-in-law Mike Manuel. He is survived by his loving wife Lisa; children Chris Randall of Verndale and Tracy Manuel of Staples; grandchildren Jared and Jailyn Manuel; brothers Bob Randall of Wadena and
