



Marvin Samuelson

July 4, 1932 - April 30, 2007

Funeral services for Marvin Samuelson of rural Verndale were held on Friday, May 4, 2007 at 2:00 PM at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Bertha. Marvin passed away on Monday, April 30, 2007 at the Department of Veteran's Affairs Medical Center in Minneapolis at the age of 74 years. Marvin Otto Samuelson was born on July 4, 1932 to Otto and Hazel (Hart) Samuelson at Sauk Centre, MN. He served his country by joining the Army in February, 1953. He was a member of the 224th Infantry in Korea and was honorably discharged in December, 1954. Marvin returned to Minnesota and made his home in Bartlett Township, rural Verndale, when he married Delores Joanna Juergens on April 23, 1955 at the Immanuel Lutheran Church in Bartlett Township. He worked the farm until he retired in 1988. He also worked maintenance for 10 years in Eagan. He served his community as a member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars and the American Legion. He enjoyed the outdoors hunting and fishing and liked mowing the lawn and fixing things. He especially liked going into Hewitt and having "coffee with the guys." Marvin is survived by his wife of 52 years Delores; sons Bruce (Doris) of Phoenix, AZ and Gary of Charlotte, NC; daughter Jane (Scott) Dettmer of Lakeville, MN; 12 grandchildren and 5 great-grandchildren; and sisters Velma (Ray) Bjorstrom of Osakis, Gladys Samuelson of New York and sister-in-law Lu Drewlow. He was preceded in death by his parents Otto and Hazel Samuelson.
