January 1, 1940 - August 14, 2007

Mary Del (Brunko) Pratt, 67 of Porter, TX formerly of Hewitt, MN died Tues, August 14, 2007 at St. John's Hospital in Clearlake, TX. She was born January 3, 1940 in Wadena, MN, the daughter of Carl and Mary (Kern) Brunko. She grew up in Hewitt, MN. Went to country school in Hewitt and graduated from Bertha-Hewitt High School in 1957. On March 21, 1959, she was united in marriage to Homer "Jim" Pratt in the Hewitt Methodist Church.
