Mildred D. Uselman was born on July 26, 1913 in Leaf River Township to Benjamin Franklin and Wreathy (Vanderhoff) LaMay. She passed away on September 17, 2005 at the Tri-County Hospital in Wadena at the age of 92 years. Mildred lived her lifetime in the Wadena community. She was united in marriage with George James Uselman on July 26, 1940 in the parish house of St. John the Baptist Church in Bluffton. She was a teacher and homemaker and was active in her community as a charter member of the Garden Club as well as a member of the 4-H club, Church Circle, Eye to Eye and Christian Women. She enjoyed horticulture and spending time with her many friends. Mildred was preceded in death by her husband George on October 5, 1989; parents Benjamin and Wreathy; son Jerry on March 8, 2003; brothers Benjamin and Arthur LaMay and sister Mabel Skog. She is survived by her children James (Carrie) of Wadena and Jennifer (Randy) Rolando of Historic Springfield, Jacksonville, FL; grandchildren Emily, Daniel and Benjamin; and sister Pearl Oyster of Long Prairie.
