



Noreen Reece

November 27, 1915 - April 15, 2011

Noreen A. Reece was born to Thomas and Anna (Jacobson) Attleson on November 27, 1915 at their home in Verndale, MN. She was the middle child with three sisters and one brother older and three brothers and one sister younger than she was. Noreen Attleson and George D. Reece were united in marriage on February 14, 1935 in Staples. They moved to George's parents' farm in Leaf River Township northeast of Wadena, and later bought a farm from Curt and Eva Reece. To this union, seven children were born, three sons and four daughters. Noreen was always busy on the farm and in the garden working with George and raising the family. Many times there were extra people at their home and she often helped her neighbors. George died in April 1977, and in 1978 she sold the farm and moved into Wadena. She enjoyed reading, poetry, gardening, quilting, church rummage sales, traveling, and anything historical including family history. She found time to drive ladies to their appointments and was sure to have food and coffee ready for visitors. She was an active member at Immanuel Lutheran Church and Wadena County Historical Society. Noreen passed away at the age of 95 years on April 15, 2011 at Fair Oaks Lodge in Wadena. She was preceded in death by her husband George on April 26, 1977; her parents Thomas and Anna; sons Harlan on May 26, 1958 and Charles on March 31, 2005; two grandsons; brothers Thomas, Elmer, Noel, and Arthur; sisters Gladys (Arnold) Grewe, Evelyn (Vern) Halverson; Louise (Gerhart) Grewe, and Marie (Don) Shaw. She is survived by her son David (Diane) Reece of Hutchinson;

daughters Lois Nelson of Perham, Donna (Ralph) Lundahl of Dassel, Karen (LaVern) Erkenbrack of Wadena, and Renee (Jim) Murray of Cedar; 18 grandchildren, 41 great-grandchildren, & 9 great-great-grandchildren; and daughter-in-law Berni Reece. Funeral services were held at 11:00 AM on April 19, 2011, at the Immanuel Lutheran Church in Wadena, with Pastor Marilyn Breckenridge officiating. Honorary pallbearers were Noreen's granddaughters, and active pallbearers were her grandsons. Interment was in Leaf River Cemetery in rural Wadena.
