January 20, 1942 - June 28, 2003

Roger Henry Mohs was born to his parents Roman & Dorothy (Roggenkamp) Mohs on January 20, 1942 at the Wesley Hospital in Wadena. He passed away at his home on June 28th after a 14 1/2 month battle with cancer of the esophagus. Roger was a 1959 graduate of Wadena Senior High School. After high school he joined the US Army where he served from 1959 to 1962 in Verona, Italy. He was united in marriage to Marjorie Schwartz on November 15, 1961 in the St. John the Baptist Catholic Church in Bluffton. Roger and Marge farmed together until his recent retirement. Roger had also recently been working with Leaf River Ag Services. Roger was a member of the Holy Family Council, the Bluffton Lions Club, Bluffton Creamery Board for 24 years, DHIA Board for 10 years, East Otter Tail King Agassig in 1978 and was Farmer of the Year in 1987. He loved to hunt with his sons in both Minnesota and out west. He also enjoyed reading western books like Louie L'Amour, fixing all things around the farm, old time music and dancing, his 4 wheeler rides and his night walks through the woods with Marge. Roger was preceded in death by his daughter Jennifer, his mother Dorothy and his sister Cheryl Frost. He is survived by his wife Marge; sons Dennis (Teresa) of Sauk Rapids, Michael (Stefanie) of Elbow Lake, Mitchell (Bethany) of Apple Valley; daughters Melissa (Doug) Anderson of Elk River, Melinda (Tim) Graham of Yuma, AZ, Doreen (Joe) Cullen of Eagan, Deborah (David) Gunderson of Grand Rapids; father Roman of Bluffton; 12 grandchildren; brothers Robert (Paulette) of Youngstown, OH, Ronald (Kathy) of Cando, ND, Randy (Sue) of
