



Roxanne Silvers

May 14, 1963 - January 23, 2009

Funeral services for Roxanne Silvers, formerly of Bertha, were held at 2:00 PM on Thursday, January 29, 2009 at the Domian-Anderson Funeral Home in Bertha. Roxanne passed away at her home in St. Louis Park on Friday, January 23, 2009 at the age of 45 years. Roxanne was born on May 14, 1963 in Taylor, MI, where she lived until her parents bought property in Bertha. She was twelve years old when they moved to Minnesota. She attended school in Bertha, and grew up enjoying the beautiful woods and ponds of the property. After graduation from Bertha-Hewitt High School, Roxanne moved to St. Cloud, MN where she attended St. Cloud State College. She graduated with a B.A. in art history, with honors, and also completed masters course classes in Middle Eastern studies and Arabic language. During this time, she also worked on productions at Theater Le Homme Dieu (summertime) in Alexandria, MN where she gained experience in costuming for several productions. Roxanne then moved to Minneapolis where for many years she was involved in the Twin Cities art communities. She also worked as a model, and with her interest in art and intricate bead work, created many original and beautiful designs. She dyed her own fabrics and created clothing using batik. She became a regular attendee of art fairs where many people collected her work, and recognized her from show to show. She began taking classes at the Minnesota School of Botanical Art, using watercolor to paint plant and mushroom specimens. Roxanne showed her work with other MSBA members and created much interest in her work. During her life in Minneapolis, she was

employed for many years at J.C. Penney, and later as a buyer for Northern Sun Merchandising. Roxanne is survived by her husband James Garrison; parents Edwin and Dortha Silvers; sister Carmen Silvers; and nieces Stephanie, Lila and Skye. When you think of Roxanne, think not what a shame it is to have lost her so soon. Roxanne was highly intellectual and very open minded, exploring many cultures, religions, scientific topics, and politics; she was very active in our world and our society. The voracity and zest with which Roxanne pursued life was always shared with those near and dear to her, but she was also highly sensitive with a keen insight into people's thoughts and perspectives. Think of all those magical events she weaved into our lives, the memories she has provided us, really the depth and core of who she was. There are so many parts of her, so many parts that she sprinkled amongst all of us that she gave us unselfishly. In her honor, we need to recognize the magic of her being, love her for who she was, and cherish our memories of her.
