



## Roy Wredberg

December 29, 1927 - January 27, 2004

Roy Lester Wredberg, age 76 of Bertha, passed away peacefully at his home. Roy was born on December 29, 1927 in the farm home of Charles Phillip and Edna (Swanson) Wredberg west of Cambridge, Minnesota. He was the third child with 2 older brothers. Roy attended grade school in rural Isanti County schools, began high school in Cambridge and completed while a resident in Anoka County after the family moved there. Before attending college, he worked for several years in Minneapolis. He graduated from Bemidji State University in 1966 with a bachelor's degree. During the years following graduation, Roy worked on various challenging and difficult assignments for federal, state, county and municipal governments, all of which were completed successfully. Roy also worked for several years in home mission work as a lay pastor at various locations. He was active in the selling of antiques and collectibles on a limited scale for several years. He self-published a poetry book entitled POEMS FOR RURAL PEOPLE and also a historical W.W.II novel THE THINGS OF HONOR, the latter completed in 1995. Roy has lived most of his life in North Central or Northern Minnesota since graduation, most recently at Bertha since 1980. Roy was preceded in death by his parents and brothers Morris and Donald, who left for their heavenly home some time ago. Honorary pallbearers are Jerry Zimmerman, Jonathan Korfe, Robert Hessling, Dennis Anderson, Roy Sibert, Steve Sibert, Harold Erickson and Gary Robben. Interment was in the Hewitt Cemetery in Hewitt.
