Scott Alan King passed away suddenly on Wed., Oct. 25th at Tri-County Hospital in Wadena. Scott was born on Dec. 15, 1956 to his parents Wendell & Ida ((Morris) King in St. Paul. Scott lived in Bemidji, Tracy and Hutchinson before moving to Wadena in 1998. He was self employed doing carpenter work, served as the Wadena Community Center Ice Arena Manager and was the girls hockey coach. Scott loved hockey, hunting, fishing and spending any amount of time outdoors. Scott was preceded in death by his parents.
