June 16, 1913 - March 17, 2009

Serena Katherine (Greiner) Endres, formerly of Bluffton, MN, passed away at the age of 95 on March 17, 2009 at Fair Oaks Lodge in Wadena. She was born on June 17, 1913, in Luxemburg, IA, to John and Theresa (Hahn) Greiner. Serena was married to Alphonse Endres on November 15, 1932 in Luxemburg, IA. They were married for 50 years until his death in May 1983. Together they had eight children. They moved to the Endres family farm in Bluffton in 1936. She helped her husband farm, tended a large garden, and enjoyed raising her chickens. She was a lifetime member of the St. John the Baptist Catholic Church in Bluffton, was active in the Christian Mother's Society, and belonged to the Bluffton Senior Citizens Group. She enjoyed spending time with her children and grandchildren, playing bingo and cards. Serena was preceded in death by her husband, Alphonse; son, Duane; her father and mother, John and Theresa Greiner; one great-granddaughter; and 11 brothers and sisters.
