February 15, 1921 - October 17, 2011

Sidney Richard Packard, 90, of Wadena passed away Monday, October 17, 2011. Sidney was born the second of two sons to Erwin and Florence (Harvey) Packard at Hewitt, Minnesota on February 15, 1921. The family farmed in Oak Valley Township. Sidney married Bernice Maroney on September 4, 1948. They worked a diversified farming operation with dairy, hogs and beef and raised two sons and two daughters. The land had been in the family for many years and was recognized as a Century Farm in 1988. Active throughout his life in the community in which he was born, Sidney was a member of the National Farmers Organization, Knights of Columbus, Wadena Whirl-A-Way Square Dance Club, Pork Producers and was a 4-H leader. He enjoyed woodworking, square dancing, researching family history, and spending time with family and friends. He and Bernice delighted in being able to travel. Trips to England and Alaska were particular highlights. They retired from the land in 2000 and moved to Wadena. They celebrated their 40th wedding anniversary in 1988 and never dreamed they would have 63 years together. In February of this year, family and friends gathered to help Sidney celebrate his 90th birthday. His comment at the time was, "I never thought I'd live to be this damn old." Sidney is survived by his wife Bernice; sons Mark (Audrey) of Mantorville and Bruce (Nona) of Papillion, NE; daughters Nancy (Ron) Leasman of Long Prairie and Christi (Bill) Dickey of Fergus Falls; 15 grandchildren and 17 great-grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his parents; brother Frank, twin siblings, and son Terence who

died at birth. The Mass of Christian Burial was held at 11:00 a.m. on Friday, October 21, 2011 at St. Ann's Catholic Church in Wadena with Father Donald Wagner as celebrant. Pallbearers were Mark Packard, Jr., Jeff Packard, David Packard, Bradley Packard, Michael Leasman, and Charles Stombaugh. Burial was in Calvary Cemetery in Wadena.
