Vera Ann (Mielke) Johnson of Wadena, and formerly of Elbow Lake, was born on April 14, 1926 to Ida (Truog) and Edward Mielke in Little Falls, MN. She passed away on September 21, 2011, at the age of 85, at her home of 37 years in Wadena. Vera graduated from Swanville High School and continued her education at Northwestern School of Nursing. On August 14, 1947, Vera Mielke and Robert Bennett Johnson were united in marriage in Minneapolis. She worked as a nurse in community hospitals while raising their family in Denison, Iowa; Wayne, Nebraska; Elbow Lake and Wadena, Minnesota. Vera was preceded in death by her husband Robert; parents Ida and Edward; brother Dale; and sister Genevieve Gallaher.
